Dear Derek,

I would like to thank you for the continuous support of the Concern Foundation Laboratories at the Lautenberg Center for Immunology and Cancer Research and to briefly update you about the recent activities in our Center.

The Lautenberg Center includes as of today around 100 students, 8 researchers and 4 professors emeriti that are still conducting research. The oldest is Prof. Ruth Gallili, who is 93 years old and still comes to the lab every day. She works on the effect cannabis has in different diseases.

The main goal of our Center is to find a cure for cancer. Indeed, in the last year two researchers in our Center, Prof. Yinon Ben-Neriah and I, developed new compounds for cancer treatment and won, as a result, two awards: The Emet Prize for Prof. Yinon Ben-Neriah and I was awarded with the Rappaport Prize. I will briefly summarize the achievements that lead to the development of these new anti-cancer drugs and the awards.

Prof. Yinon Ben-Neriah, one of Israel's leading biomedical researchers, reached extraordinary achievements in the field of cancer research. He developed a biological treatment for leukemia which has reached a 50% cure rate in a mouse model. The treatment is now entering

clinical trials. Prior to this outstanding achievement, Prof. Ben-Neriah had several other breakthroughs including, deciphering the first molecular link between inflammation and cancer and identifying a new type of smoldering inflammation which affects approximately a quarter of all cancer types.

In my lab we work on Natural Killer (NK) cells, which are part of the innate immune system. They are specialized first responder cells which eliminate cancerous cells, virally infected cells, and deleterious pathogens. Vigorous work by me and my colleagues led to the discovery of novel mechanisms by which NK cells recognize and kill many important viruses, including influenza and the human cytomegalovirus. Moreover, we uncovered how NK cells recognize bacteria and fungi; an important step forward for clinical research, since many of these pathogens are currently untreatable. In addition, we discovered how NK cells recognize and kill different cancers, and concomitantly how these cancers evade elimination by NK cells. These discoveries led to the creation of novel immunotherapies aimed at enhancing the NK cells' capability to combat these cancers. The immunotherapies are currently being developed by various companies, some established by myself and colleagues, and are located both in Israel and abroad. Excitingly, some

of these immunotherapies are already being tested on humans in clinical trials, and others are presently in the developmental stage.

Our Center is run by an amazing administrative team headed by Moriah Sapir (MBA). Moriah is trying to expand the Center's activities, to reach international recognition and create new programs that can give rise to the development of novel and improved treatments for cancer. You can find more details about the Center's activities by visiting our website https://lautenbergcenter.org/.

We are currently trying to recruit new professors to our Center and I hope that your continuous support and contribution will help us achieve our goals.

I hope that you are proud of the Center's achievements, as we are. Without your support and friendship, the Concern Foundation Laboratories at the Lautenberg Center for Immunology and Cancer Research could not exist.

A New LA Marathon Fundraising Record for Team Concern
